## CALL FOR PROPOSALS

First Submission Deadline: December 30th, 2024

The Quechua Alliance, a community organization that aims to celebrate Andean Culture and the Quechua/Kichwa language in the United States since 2015, in conjunction with the Center for Latin American and Caribbean Studies (CLACS) and the Global Indigenous Studies Network (GISN) within the Hamilton Lugar School of Global and International Studies (HLS) at Indiana University, invite educators, community leaders, scholars and students to send proposals for presentations at the 9th Quechua Alliance which will take place at Indiana University-Bloomington on May 3, 2025. Presentations can take the form of interactive activities, interactive workshops, open discussions or interactive scholarly talks. Each presentation will last up to 15 minutes in total and can be presented by one person or a group of people.

Presentations can be given in Quechua, Spanish, or English. Priority will be given to presentations that include interactive content. All presentations, regardless of type, must include the following:

- Name(s) and title of the presentation(s), institutional affiliation(s), and contact information
- Title of the proposed presentation Abstract (250 words)
- Indicate any A/V equipment needs for your presentation

Please submit a title and a 250-word abstract of your presentation through the online submission system.

The first deadline for receipt of proposals is December 30th, 2024.

Please note that unfortunately, the event committee will be unable to assist with participant expenses for travel and lodging to participate in the event at Indiana University Bloomington. This is an **in-person** event.

- Quechua/Quichua children's books
- Quechua/Quichua programs and courses at universities in the US
- Online Quechua/Quichua courses
- Pragmatics in teaching and learning of Quechua/Quichua
